

Ensuring inclusive education remains a priority for the Department of Education (DepEd) and UNICEF, particularly for learners with disabilities. The **Development and Production of Digital Learning Materials for Deaf Learners** initiative aims to address educational barriers faced by deaf students by enhancing access to digital learning resources and improving teacher competency in utilizing these materials. In parallel, the **Training Workshop on Effective Utilization of Integrated Language and Reading Lesson Exemplars** supports early-grade teachers in implementing the **MATATAG curriculum** using structured literacy frameworks and DepEd storybooks.

Objectives

The project aims to achieve the following objectives:

- Improve access to and quality of digital learning materials for deaf learners by converting existing Self-Learning Modules (SLMs) into accessible ePubs with embedded Filipino Sign Language (FSL).
 Enhance teachers' competencies in utilizing digital learning resources effectively through capacity-building workshops.
 - •Strengthen the DepEd Learning Management System (LMS) by integrating a monitoring and evaluation (M&E) system to track usage and effectiveness.
 - •Develop structured training modules aligned with the DepEd National Educators Academy of the Philippines (NEAP) template to guide teachers in utilizing Lesson Exemplars for literacy instruction.

Methodology

The project employed a multi-phase approach:

- •Content Development: Conversion of 500 Ready-to-Print SLMs into ePub formats with embedded FSL interpretation.
 - •Capacity Building: Training of 2,500 teachers and supervisors on the effective use of digital learning resources.
- •**M&E System Development:** Customization and pilot testing of an LMS-integrated monitoring system to assess engagement and impact.
- •**Training Module Development:** Alignment of training materials with DepEd NEAP standards, ensuring structured implementation for literacy instruction.

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Executive Summary

Key Findings

Digital Learning for Deaf Learners

•Deaf students face **significant barriers** in accessing traditional education due to **limited specialized resources**, **lack of sign language integration**, **and low teacher competency in inclusive education**.

•Converting **SLMs into ePubs with FSL** provides a scalable, accessible learning tool for online and offline use.

•Teachers require **ongoing training** to implement digital tools effectively, highlighting the need for **structured professional development**.

•The **DepEd LMS requires enhancements** to monitor and sustain digital learning initiatives.

Training on Lesson Exemplars for Literacy Instruction

•The MATATAG curriculum emphasizes **early-grader literacy development**, requiring structured teaching approaches.

•Integrating **DepEd storybooks** into **Lesson Exemplars** provides a structured framework for literacy instruction.

•Key challenges include teacher readiness, lack of training on integrated lesson planning, and inconsistencies in curriculum implementation.

•The training module design aligns with the **Philippine Professional Standards for Teachers (PPST)**, ensuring professional competency development.





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Recommendations

1. Expand Digital Learning Resource Development

- Continue scaling the conversion of SLMs into accessible formats beyond the initial 500 modules.
- Strengthen partnerships with organizations supporting deaf education to ensure sustainable resource development.

2. Enhance Teacher Training & Support

- Institutionalize **teacher training on inclusive digital learning** through DepEd NEAP.
- Develop **peer mentoring programs** where trained educators support colleagues in adopting digital learning tools.

3. Optimize Monitoring & Evaluation Systems

- Fully integrate the M&E system within the **DepEd LMS** to track engagement, assess impact, and inform continuous improvements.
- Conduct periodic evaluations and feedback sessions with **teachers and learners** to refine training methodologies.

4. Strengthen Literacy Instruction Through Lesson Exemplars

- Provide **ongoing coaching and mentoring** for teachers on structured literacy instruction using **DepEd storybooks**.
- Align Lesson Exemplars with **regional learning needs**, ensuring adaptability across different contexts.

Conclusion

The Development and Production of Digital Learning Materials for Deaf Learners and the Training Workshop on Effective Utilization of Integrated Language and Reading Lesson Exemplars represent critical steps in fostering inclusive and high-quality education in the Philippines.
